We want our children to learn to appreciate listening, composing and performing a range of musical genres, which reflect the history of music, but is also relevant to the modern day. Children will access a range of quality musical experiences which are designed to engage and inspire them, including vocal and instrumental activities, which allow them to explore and deepen their knowledge and skills. At the heart of our curriculum are creativity and excitement, which enables children to develop increased confidence, self-esteem, as well as their knowledge and skills whilst also supporting their personal development.
